## Lincoln Mark VII Trunk Cleaning

After deciding that I had had enough of having a nasty looking trunk, I figured I would do something about it. Therefore, I went about removing 2+ yrs. of car show fliers, dirty cleaning rags, tools, two jacks, old spark plug wires, and a partially constructed mouse adobe. I have included for your viewing pleasure, before and after pictures so you can see how it turned out. For the most part it turned out nice, not perfect but a lot better than it was.

For this cleaning job, I enlisted the help of a friend called Tuff Stuff Multi-purpose Foam Cleaner. This can be found in hardware stores as well as Wal-Mart and Autozone for about \$4 bucks per can. It works very well in taking out tough stains, grease, grime, blood (heh heh).

For fabric and carpets, test first on a small hidden area to ensure color fastness and resistance to stain or spotting.

- 1. REMOVE EVERYTHING FROM THE TRUNK.
- 2. Shake well
- 3. Hold can upright and spray liberally on surface to be cleaned. (some stains may require more than one application)
- 4. Let Tuff Stuff foam work for about 30-40 seconds.
- 5. Scrub with damp cloth, sponge or brush if required.
- 6. Wipe clean with dry cloth. (Once dry I like to re-vacuum the area cleaned due to the fact the foam pulls dirt up from the carpet that the vacuum didn't get the first time)
- 7. Finally, to avoid spotting, wipe overspray from glass or car finish before it dries. If it should dry, use powdered cleanser to remove from glass, and car polish to remove from finish.
